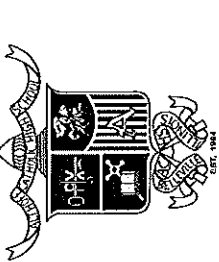

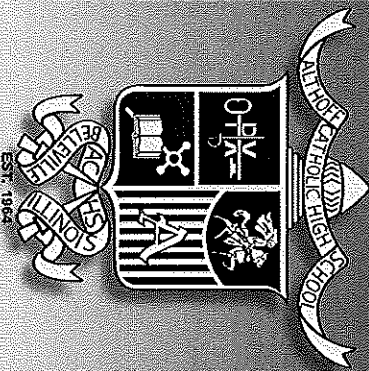

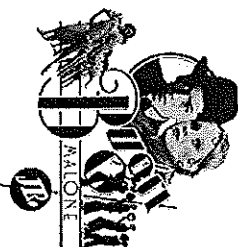
Drama and Show Choir
